1) As refugees fled Port au Prince we supplied one weeks worth of food, a change of clothes, medical care, and a place to sleep as they migrated to their home villages to stay with family and friends

2) We gave weekly food bags to all refugees who settled into the Pignon area. We also provided shelter for them in our churches, orphanage, and small house on our property until they could figure out where to live in the area.

3) When food riots began we realized we were endangering our orphans and ourselves by owning food so we decided to use the money donated to provide monthly money to each refugee family to buy food, clothes, medical and other needs. Our local Pastors and church committees knew of each family who had taken in refugees and oversee the distribution at our churches in small groups. 4 areas of Haiti are recipients of this money. We have already given out 3 months of aid and have budgeted for 9 more months of aid.

4) We did **NOT** open refuges camps due to dependence, disease and sanitation issues. All of our refugees live with families and friends. With 16,000 people flooding the area, we did not want to operate that way.

- 5) We are opening a free clinic in LeJeune Haiti, to care for the poorest of the poor, as all of these people will need first aid and medical care for malaria etc. as the hurricane season arrives in June.
- 6) We found that most “on the ground” care was given by small Christian organizations like ourselves. Most large agencies were mired in bureaucracy and could not respond or regroup efficiently.
- 7) We also have made uniforms for all school children and have placed the refugee children in our schools. This has become a large burden on teachers, as you can well imagine.
- 8) We began showing the Jesus Film in every area of the plateau, as there was a huge revival to counteract the voodoo services that were held.

We cannot convey to you all the comfort your money and supplies have given to survivors who came to us in shock and anguish. Everyone in Haiti lost someone they loved in that earthquake. Also, with so many colleges in Port au Prince, many of the most educated for the next generation were lost as well. We praise God for your kindness and concern. We will keep you posted via our website and our newsletter as life continues in Haiti.
